"For Me Personally" -

(A devotion based on the well-known hymn "I am Trusting You, Lord Jesus" - CWH 816)

"I know whom I have believed, and am convinced that he is able to guard what I have entrusted to him until that day" (2 Timothy 1:12).

Catechism students learn that saving faith in God involves three essential ingredients: knowledge, assent or acceptance, and trust. Knowledge comes as a person is taught God's Word. Acceptance is announced when one makes a confession of faith. But the trust part is a lifelong struggle that requires God's daily help.

Trust personalizes your faith. Trust is not just that God has justified the world but that God has justified me. Trust is not just that Jesus is the friend of sinners but that Jesus is my friend. Trust is not just that Jesus answers prayers but that Jesus answers my prayers. Notice how the personal pronoun "I" is repeated in Frances Havergal's hymn "I Am Trusting You, Lord Jesus." She personalized her knowledge and acceptance with a rich measure of trust that all of God's promises in Christ Jesus applied directly to her. Her trust included salvation (st. 1); pardon and cleansing (sts. 2,3); guidance (st. 4); power, especially to witness (st. 5); and, in general, all that God offered her in Christ Jesus (st. 6).

David wrote, "I trust in your unfailing love; my heart rejoices in your salvation. I will sing the LORD's praise, for he has been good to me" (Psalm 13:5,6). A growing trust in the Lord results in a rejoicing heart, which naturally leads to an outburst in song. That song may very well be Frances Havergal's hymn "I Am Trusting You, Lord Jesus."

Q: How long does it take for a family to get an answer to whether they qualify or not and what the amount of the scholarship will be?

A: The information we have states a 5 day response time from the time of submission online. If there is missing information on an application, the applicant would know that within the five days and be able to submit the missing information and then the 5 days begins again. If forms are submitted by regular mail, the timeline is largely dependent on the speed of the postal service.
