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### **1st and 2nd Grade**

Cursive – the second graders will begin transitioning to cursive writing. This week they will now be completing their Spelling in cursive. The words in their Spelling books are also written in cursive to aide them in properly connecting the letters. It is very important for the first graders to continue practicing our school handwriting program. We use D’Nealian which helps in learning cursive writing. Kindergarteners and first graders learn to put the curves at the end of letters that end on the line. These curves become the connectors in cursive writing.

English: Both grades will be finishing up chapter 6. We will start writing "Personal Narratives" on Thursday.

### **5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> Grade**

Hello, from the 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> grade room.

Spelling: We are looking at Unit 23.

Hymnology: We will be learning hymn 105:1, 7 for this Wednesday. For next Wednesday, we will recite 268:1-3.

Novel: We are reading Julie of the Wolves and Julie has to decide what she can do to keep up with the wolves as they get ready to head off on their nomadic summer routine.

Language arts: 6<sup>th</sup> will be looking at various ways of combining sentences with adjectives. 5<sup>th</sup> grade will begin looking at common misuses of adjectives.



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Geography: We will continue looking at the continent of Europe including WWI and WWII.
