Please keep in mind and remind your children that these tests do not count toward any grade that they will ever receive; these tests are meant to help teachers, parents, and the students see where the students' strengths and weaknesses are, as well as helping the faculty see strengths and weaknesses in our curriculum. These tests also serve as an excellent "practice" for the students to see and feel how a high stakes test such as the ACTs or SATs will be like.

As your child prepares for these tests (and really any day), here are a few tips and suggestions for preparing the body and mind for a day of testing or school:

Sleep - Get plenty of rest the night before your exam.

Diet - Eat a nutritious meal that includes protein before testing. This may help calm your nerves and will give your brain energy to think. Avoid caffeine (coffee, tea, soda, pop, chocolate, etc.) candy, greasy, heavy or acidic foods and overeating.

Stay relaxed and confident - Keep a good attitude and remind yourself that you are going to do your best. If you find yourself panicking, take a few deep breaths.

Pray - God tells us time and time again in his Word to come to him in every situation. Even taking a minute before a test to ask God for help is an opportunity to be reminded that God is with us no matter what the situation.

Hopefully, these tips and suggestions can help your child demonstrate his or her talents and gifts to the best of their God-given abilities. May God bless our students as they demonstrate their gifts and talents.
