“The Father’s Care” -

(A devotion based on this week’s hymn: “Children of the Heavenly Father” - CWH 502)

This is a hymn that touches our hearts as we think about our children. We would not be so attracted to it if we thought that our children were never in danger. But we know that they are. And this awareness makes us love this hymn because it reminds us who (and whose) our children really are.

Perhaps we’re not always aware of the evil and dangers that swirl around us. Who knows how many dangers God has simply prevented us from ever seeing? How many catastrophes have his holy angels averted from our lives without our even knowing it?

On the other hand, at the slightest sign of danger, we worry about what might be. When a child’s persistent fever doesn’t respond to treatment, we struggle to remain calm and reasonable. When the slightest strange symptom appears in our body, we wonder what the doctor will say. When increasingly independent teenagers don’t call home like they promised, we fear the worst. Usually, the worst never happens. But we know that it can.

Whether the situation is not as bad as we feared or even far more serious than we thought, the Scriptures are replete with the comforting news of our heavenly Father’s care. This hymn weaves those thoughts together and allows us to sing the truth into our hearts. Whether we know it or not (when things are going fine), whether we would believe it or not (when things aren’t fine), we need to remember that “though he giveth or he taketh, God his children ne’er forsaketh” (st. 4). After all, they are (and we too are) “Children of the Heavenly Father.”
