"Filled With the Holy Spirit" -

(A devotion based on this week's hymn: "O Light of Gentile Nations" CWH 497)

Are you not filled with awe at how the Holy Spirit came into the life of Simeon and led him to see Jesus as the Light of the world? Luke tells us, "He [Simeon] was waiting for the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit was on him" (Luke 2:25). The Holy Spirit had revealed to him that he would not die until he had seen the Lord's Christ. The Holy Spirit even moved him to go to the temple on the very day that Joseph and Mary brought Jesus to the temple to be presented before the Lord. It was the Holy Spirit who moved Simeon to joyfully proclaim, "My eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the sight of all nations: a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of your people Israel" (Luke 2:30-32).

When we gather for worship with God's people, it is the Holy Spirit who leads us to see Jesus as the Light of the world. With this hymn we joyfully proclaim, "Drawn by your Spirit's leading, we come with joy and love . . . as Simeon once had waited his God and Lord to find" (st. 1). In the arms of faith we embrace Jesus as Simeon once did. With mouth and lips we receive his body and blood in the blessed Sacrament.

There will be days "when life's troubles touch us" and times when "through our tears we often can scarcely sense [God's] grace" (st. 3). With the help of the Holy Spirit, we see Jesus as Simeon once did: "Our sun in darkest terrors, the glory round our cross." And when our last hour comes, the Holy Spirit will be there as our Comforter to help us pray, "Lord, now let your servant depart in peace."

Prayer: O blessed Holy Spirit, you led Simeon to see the son of Mary and Joseph as his long awaited Savior. We thank you for leading us to see Jesus for who he truly is and for embracing him with arms of faith. Amen.
