Christian Thinking-

(A devotion based on this week's hymn: "Take My Life and Let it Be" CW 695)

"Take my intellect and use every power as thou shalt choose." (st. 4)

What is the point of Christian education? We all know that Christian math is not "Jesus had 12 disciples and one of them betrayed him. How many are left?" But what exactly do we mean when we say that every subject in our curriculum is taught "in the light of God's Word"?

Sometimes God's Word speaks directly to a subject, and when it does, we include those words in our instruction. Forgiveness of sins through faith in Christ Jesus is the central message of our religion classes and the most important thing we teach. Biblical instructions for daily living are valuable parts of the curriculum.

As we take every thought captive to Christ, we realize that the context of everything we teach is also important. How will we use math in our lives to the glory of God? Who will be glorified by our discoveries regarding the laws of nature? How does knowing that "God wants everyone to be saved" help us to interpret historical events?

Incorporating the Word of God into every lesson plan is not simple. It is not always easy for our students—or even for us—to interpret the events of life in a Christian way. And so we pray for help, "Take my intellect and use every power as thou shalt choose."
