Church Extension Fund Stamps The students in school have an opportunity to assist our WELS Church Extension Fund. Each Wednesday after chapel, they may purchase saving stamps at \$1 each. The stamps are then placed in a stamp album until it grows to \$20. The stamp book application is filled out by the student's parent and returned with the full stamp book to the WELS CEF office. WELS CEF then issues a One Year Savings Certificate in the child's name and sends it to their permanent home address. The parent is the custodian on these investment certificates so that statements and maturity notices can be handled accordingly. Additional investments may be made to an existing Stamp Program certificate at any time using the Additional Investment-Partial Redemption Form. Parents, grand-parents and students are encouraged to continue adding additional investments to the certificate. Contact the school office if you have any questions about the CEF Stamp program.
