“He Lives!”

(A devotion based on the well-known hymn “I Know That My Redeemer Lives” CW 441 - a hymn the students are studying now.)

Jesus lives! This is the central truth of Scripture and of our faith.

But do we sometimes forget this glorious truth? Do we sometimes live as if Jesus is still lifeless in a grave? How might that happen? If we easily excuse our sins, aren't we forgetting that he lives and will return to judge the living and the dead? If we are worried about having enough money or time or happiness, aren't we forgetting he indeed lives and has the ability to provide all that we need?

He lives! This hymn proclaims this life-giving truth 31 times. Our Redeemer lives! And because he lives, we have been ransomed from sin's guilt and death's eternal grasp. We have an advocate with the Father because he lives to plead for us above. When we stand at the grave of a loved one who has died in faith, we have hope because he lives to wipe away our tears. When the future looks bleak or uncertain, we do not give up because he lives to help in time of need. When we worry about having enough, we turn to him who lives to grant us rich supply. When we must walk through death's darkest valley, we are not alone because he lives and will bring us home to the Father's house where he now lives to prepare a place for us.

Jesus lives! It is the truth we need to repeatedly remember. Jesus lives triumphant and victorious. And his victory is ours—we have a Savior who meets every need for our bodies and souls for today and forever. With joyful, thankful hearts and voices, we are privileged to proclaim:
