“A Meal Like No Other” -

(A devotion based on the hymn: “Here, O My Lord, I See You Face to Face” - CWH 660)

Humans mark important occasions with eating. It's true of every culture in every time. Weddings and funerals, state dinners and business meals, birthdays and reunions. Just about every family reunion includes these three actions: eating, drinking, and talking. It is how we were made. We break bread to enjoy fellowship and to mark significant events.

It is not surprising, then, that when the Lord comes to us, he comes in Word and meal. When the family of God gathers, we talk. We talk about our past and our future, about our biblical relatives (good and bad!), and of course about our most famous brother, Christ. And then we dine. It is a fellowship like no other. How simple yet how profound. Heaven and earth crash together for this meal of simple bread and wine.

Yet family reunions don't last forever. We go back to our regular lives. The Sunday service of talking and dining doesn't last forever either. We walk out of church and go back to our day-to-day lives. “Too soon we rise; the vessels disappear. The feast, though not the love, is past and gone” (st. 5). But there is an eternal feast. A family reunion in heaven. A wedding supper like none other:

We know that there will be a day shortly when we will see the unseen and dine with our Lord. Until then we lean on him as our strength and hope, an oasis in our desert.

Prayer: Heavenly groom, you have made your church your bride and have prepared a wedding banquet for us. Keep coming to us in Word and meal, and show us your love until we are seated at this great heavenly feast. Amen.
