Dialogue

P: I believe that God created me and all that exists, and that he gave me my body and soul, eyes, ears and all my members, my mind and all my abilities.

C: By faith we understand that the universe was formed at God's command, so that what is seen was not made out of what was visible.

P: God still preserves me by richly and daily providing clothing and shoes, food and drink, house and home, spouse and children, land, cattle, and all I own, and all I need to keep my body and life.

C: The Lord makes grass grow for the cattle, and plants for people to cultivate—bringing forth food from the earth.

P: I believe that Jesus Christ, true God, begotten of the Father from eternity, and also true man, born of the virgin Mary, is my Lord.

C: When the set time had fully come, God sent his Son, born of a woman, born under the law, to redeem those under the law, that we might receive adoption to sonship.

P: Christ has redeemed me, a lost and condemned creature, purchased and won me from all sins, from death and from the power of the devil, not with gold or silver, but with his holy, precious blood and with his innocent suffering and death.

C: The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

P: I believe that I cannot by my own thinking or choosing believe in Jesus Christ, my Lord, or come to him. But the Holy Spirit has called me by the gospel, enlightened me with his gifts, sanctified and kept me in the true faith.

C: No one can enter the kingdom of God unless they are born of water and the Spirit. Flesh gives birth to flesh, but the Spirit gives birth to spirit.

P: In the same way, the Holy Spirit calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies the whole Christian Church on earth, and keeps it with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.

C: There is one body and one Spirit, just as you were called to one hope when you were called; one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all, who is over all and through all and in all.

P: Oh, the depth of the riches of the wisdom and knowledge of God! From him and through him and for him are all things.

C: To him be the glory forever! Amen.



⁷But to each one of us grace has been given as Christ apportioned it. ⁸This is why it says: "When he ascended on high, he took many captives and gave gifts to his people." ⁹(What does "he ascended" mean except that he also descended to the lower, earthly regions? ¹⁰He who descended is the very one who ascended higher than all the heavens, in order to fill the whole universe.) ¹¹So Christ himself gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers, ¹²to equip his people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up ¹³until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ. ¹⁴Then we will no longer be infants, tossed back and forth by the waves, and blown here and there by every wind of teaching and by the cunning and craftiness of people in their deceitful scheming. ¹⁵Instead, speaking the truth in love, we will grow to become in every respect the mature body of him who is the head, that is, Christ. ¹⁶From him the whole body, joined and held together by every supporting ligament, grows and builds itself up in love, as each part does its work.

Sermon Text Hebrews 6:13–20

¹³When God made his promise to Abraham, since there was no one greater for him to swear by, he swore by himself, ¹⁴saying, "I will surely bless you and give you many descendants." ¹⁵And so after waiting patiently, Abraham received what was promised. ¹⁶People swear by someone greater than themselves, and the oath confirms what is said and puts an end to all argument. ¹⁷Because God wanted to make the unchanging nature of his purpose very clear to the heirs of what was promised, he confirmed it with an oath. ¹⁸God did this so that, by two unchangeable things in which it is impossible for God to lie, we who have fled to take hold of the hope set before us may be greatly encouraged. ¹⁹We have this hope as an anchor for the soul, firm and secure. It enters the inner sanctuary behind the curtain, ²⁰where our forerunner, Jesus, has entered on our behalf.

Installation of a Mr. Sam Evans

To the congregation:

P: Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ said to his church: "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age."

The Savior loves children and desires to share all his promises with them. Christian schools provide believers with a unique opportunity to pass on the truths of the gospel to the next generation. We do this work in Jesus' name, who is the Good Shepherd of the young and delights to see them grow in grace and spiritual knowledge.

To the called worker:

P: Dear brother, you have been called to serve as 7th & 8th grade teacher and assistant principal of Trinity Lutheran School. You have been prepared for this ministry by careful instruction in the Word of God so that you are able to carry out your duties in conformity with that Word.

As a servant of Christ, you are to carry out your responsibilities in the light of God's Word and lead all those you serve to understand God's holy law and saving gospel. You are to keep your students in your prayers and guide and guard their spiritual growth.

You are to set aside time for personal study of the Scriptures so that you may grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. You are to strive to be an example of Christian faith and life so that others may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

You are to work together with the parents of your children so that the witness of law and gospel may be consistent in their home and school.

As principal you are to serve alongside the other called workers in this ministry. You are to strive to create an atmosphere where Christian love directs all things and where both faculty and students may flourish. You are to care for the faculty under your authority with special concern for their spiritual growth, as well as their correct teaching and application of Scripture. You are to oversee the curriculum and instruction in the school so that all learning takes place in the light of God's Word. You are to be diligent in maintaining a safe and positive learning environment.

In all your tasks and responsibilities, our Lord Jesus equips you with the gospel of the forgiveness of sins, the gift that makes you truly competent as a servant of Christ. St. Paul wrote: "Not that we are competent in ourselves to claim anything for ourselves, but our competence comes from God."

P: In keeping with the Word and will of the Lord, I ask you before God and his people:

Do you believe that the canonical books of the Old and New Testaments are the inspired and inerrant Word of God and the only source of truth for faith and ministry?

I do.

P: Do you accept the three Ecumenical Creeds—the Apostles', the Nicene, and the Athanasian—as faithful testimonies to the truth of the Holy Scriptures, and do you reject all the errors that they condemn?

I do.

P: Do you solemnly promise that all your service in its various forms will conform to the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions?

I do.

P: Will you endeavor to live a life that reflects the love God has for you so that all may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven?

I will, and I ask God to help me.

P: Are you willing to carry out this work according to the grace that God gives? *I am, and I ask God to help me.*

To the congregation:

P: Friends in Christ,

You have heard the promises spoken by the teacher and assistant principal you have called. I encourage you to receive him with joy and remember what the Word of God calls you to do.

Work together with him for the benefit of the Lord's kingdom, so that your shared service may bring spiritual blessings to the Savior's people.

Support him as he oversees the education of the young, so that they may be brought up in the training and instruction of the Lord.

Keep him and his work in your prayers, so that his ministry may be blessed and that he might carry out his work with joy.

Provide for his physical needs, for the Savior says, "The worker deserves his wages."

Honor and love him, as St. Peter urges: "All of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble."

I now ask you in the presence of God:

Are you willing to receive your principal as a servant of Christ? Will you show him love and honor and support him with your gifts and prayers? If so, answer: We will, and we ask God to help us.

C: We will, and we ask God to help us.

P: The almighty and merciful God strengthen you to do what you have promised.

To the students:

P: The servant of the Savior we are about to install has been called to be the principal (and teacher) in your school. As you learn from him, show your love for Jesus by respecting and listening to him, especially when he shares the Word of God with you. The Savior calls on you to honor and obey all your teachers and instructors so that their work may bring them joy and be a blessing to you.

Installation

P: Samuel Evans, I install you as 7th & 8th grade teacher and assistant principal at Trinity Evangelical Lutheran School in the name of the Father and of the + Son and of the Holy Spirit.

P: The Lord pour out on you his Holy Spirit for the work you have been called to do that you may faithfully carry out all your duties and responsibilities with the Word of God as your confidence and guide.

Please stand.

P: Let us pray.

Almighty God, source of all wisdom, we thank you for the opportunity we have to send our children to Lutheran schools. May your life-giving Word be the center of all teaching and every activity so that all may come to know and believe your holy law and saving gospel. Equip our new principal with spiritual wisdom that he may faithfully carry out the duties of his call. Move our students to godly obedience and cause them to grow through their instruction in your Word so that they may serve you throughout their lives and finally inherit eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

To the called worker:

P: The Lord bless you and make your ministry a blessing to others.




